

# Gabrielle

## SUPPLIES

M186 abc Gabrielle mold set  
Seeley's Lady White Porcelain slip  
Mini Liner  
Deer Foot Stippler  
Detail Brush  
Small China Mop

Virginia's Rosey Cheek China Paint  
Cobalt Blue  
Gloss Black  
Hair Brown  
Mohair  
Pipe Cleaners

Using Seeley's Lady White cast all pieces. You'll need to thin slip slightly. This is especially true for arms and legs. Clean and fire all pieces to Cone 7.

Sand bisque until silky smooth. Give an overall wash of "Rosey Cheeks". Fire to Cone 018.

Using a Mini Liner paint tiny lower lashes. With Detail brush paint lips creating a bow. I used First Kiss. The eyebrows are a single arched stroke, brush used is a Mini Liner, color is Hair Brown. Fire to Cone 018.

The irises are Cobalt Blue, applied with a Detail brush. Put a small amount of painting media on cheek area. Dab a small amount of Rosey Cheek color on bisque and blend with a Deer Foot Stippler. Fire to Cone 018.

Apply Gloss Black to pupil area. Check to see if any colors need deepening. Blush other body parts. Fire to Cone 018.

To assemble this doll I use pipe cleaners. This makes her very posable. She should be about 5 1/2 inches tall. (See Diagram at right)

When dressing her I use scraps of silk dipped in Petal Porcelain. Drape on doll and let dry. This effect has a wet look to it. Using this method, there is no sewing involved.

The hair is a piece of mohair glued to her head, giving her a wind blown hairdo.
